Dear Friends, 250th Celebration & Church Tower Gift Day

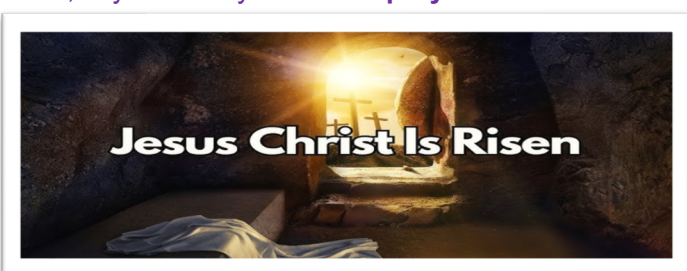

CHURCH TOWER

APPEAL 2026

Over the past years, the Select Vestry have followed a plan to upgrade and maintain our buildings.

In 2019, we as a parish completed a total renovation of the Parish Hall. In 2023, we renovated the Vicarage and now we need to address necessary repairs to our Church Tower. These were highlighted in the recent 5 yearly Report that the Diocese creates for each Parish about their buildings.

Essentially, the Report identified works that would:

Take down and re-build all pinnacles to Tower.

Re-dress flashings to flat roof to Tower and temporary patching.

Provide waterproof covering to floor to Tower below Bell.

Fit Lead to first stage Tower ledge.

Fit ventilated pane to Tower window.

Renew the flat roof covering to Tower.

This project has been costed at £40,000. We will use Lead as the best material to stop water leaking into the Tower and begin to dry out the slight damp we already have. As you can also see, the pinnacles need repaired with the recent storm creating more damage. The steel cramps inside each pinnacle needs to be replaced.

The programme of works could hopefully begin in June and will include scaffolding, most likely behind the Tower.

So....we need to raise £40,000 through our Gift Day available Church grants and other money people may donate through 250th events. We will aim to finish our fund raising by Christmas. We also have money generously given by two American families (Connor & Moffat) which came to around £5k. I was so very encouraged with their huge blessing.

So on 22 March, a Gift Day we will produce envelopes to use as well as a leaflet with our Bank details. Please prayerfully consider what you can give that this work can be completed and paid for this year. Thank you Chris & The Select Vestry.

County Down is fortunate to have two fine windows created by Karl Parsons who was one of the leading twentieth-century English stained-glass artists associated with the Arts and Crafts movement.

The two windows date from the 1920s and are the only examples of his work on the island of Ireland and are located a relatively short distance apart from each other in St John Baptist Church of Ireland, Helen's Bay and the Church of Saintfield.



Dr David Caron is giving a talk on the story behind the windows, their symbolism and their uniqueness

David Caron's PhD research at Trinity College Dublin focused on Michael Healy and the stained-glass artists of An Túr Gloine.

He was one of the three original compilers of the Gazetteer of Irish stained glass in 1988 and was editor and principal author of the revised and expanded edition in 2021.

His book, Michael Healy, 1873-1941: An Túr Gloine's stained glass pioneer, was published by Four Courts Press in 2023. His most recent book, just published, is Dublin's-Stained Glass – a guide to the finest twentieth-century windows. He is currently researching a book on the best of Ulster's twentieth-century stained glass.

This is a free event and there will be light refreshments served afterwards.

9 FACTS ABOUT THE RESURRECTION

Based on the information in
Evidence That Demands a Verdict

1 Christianity is worthless without the resurrection.

1 Cor. 15:14 (NKJV): And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty.

Scholars agree that without the resurrection there is no Christianity (ETDV 236 – 237).

3 The resurrection validates everything Jesus said.

Matthew 12:40 (NKJV): For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.

Jesus claimed both messiahship and divinity. His resurrection proved it.

According to C.S. Lewis' trilemma, Jesus was either a liar, a lunatic, or He was indeed Lord.

5 Jesus appeared to many people.

The New Testament records multiple times when Jesus appeared not as a spirit but in physical form (ETDV 264).

John 2:19 (NKJV): Jesus answered and said to them, 'Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.'

7 Multiple eyewitnesses tell the story.

1 Cor. 15:5-6 (NKJV): ...and that He was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve. After that He was seen by over five hundred brethren at once, of whom the greater part remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep.

9 We have hope in the resurrection.

Romans 6:23 (NKJV): For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

John 10:10 (NKJV): The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.

WHY

2 The resurrection is foundational to our faith.

Without the reality of the resurrection, Christianity claims no real hope or truth.

1 Cor. 15:17 (NKJV): And if Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins!

BECAUSE

WHAT WAS JESUS' RESURRECTION?

4 The resurrection was the reversal of death.

What the early Christians proclaimed through Jesus' resurrection was unique in the Greco-Roman world.

The complete reversal of death was so radical, it wasn't permitted in mythology (ETDV 233).

HOW DO WE KNOW?

WAS HIS DEATH REAL?

6 Jesus' crucifixion is a known fact.

Both skeptical and believing scholars conclude He lived and was crucified at the hands of the Romans (ETDV 246-247).

DID SOMEONE SEE IT?

WHAT HAPPENED TO THE DISCIPLES?

8 The resurrection changed the disciples.

The scared disciples became willing to give their lives for Jesus (ETDV Chapter 13).

They openly proclaim Jesus as Christ. Read Peter's message in Acts 2.

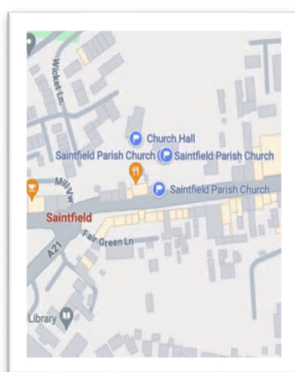
